Kathmandu Model Hospital

The KMH received € 14.285 in pandemic aid for monitors. oxygen and suction lines, four intensive care beds, Covid tests and other materials, as well as € 30,000 for its own oxygen production plant.

Covid-19 Pandemic

Nepalmed UK was able to deliver ten oxygen concentrators to our partners. As a donation from GMTZ Jena, fourteen oxygen concentrators were handed over to rural providers. The maternity ward in Namjung was equipped with instruments and solar panels by the Rotary Club Wuppertal-Süd. Two webinars on urgent medical issues of the pandemic, available on the internet, were filmed and distributed by Nepalmed UK and the Nepalese Respiratory Society. Furthermore, we continue to sponsor the trauma ward at Bayalpata Hospital with € 10,000 annually.

Matrika Eve Center Kathmandu

The eye centre received € 25,000 for the purchase of a laser for the treatment of various eye diseases. In addition, an eye diagnostic device donated by the University Hospital Dresden was



delivered. With our financial support, Matrika built a 100bed guarantine station in a school during the second wave of the pandemic in May 2021. Here, the patients received medical care as well as food and physiotherapy. Arne Drews

German projects

The Nepalmed Foundation, established on 1 May 2020 to secure the projects in the long term, has been able to build up an endowment fund of € 60,000.

In view of the Covid-related restrictions, we gave only a few talks about developments in Nepal. Nepalmed had a booth at the Mountain Film Night in Thallwitz. On 21 October 2021, an extensive photo exhibition with one hundred large-format photographs by Rüdiger Wenzel about Nepal and Nepalmed opened in the building of the Rostock Medical Association. 



Health Posts in Lahan, Province 2



In 2021, our volunteer work in Nepal was again largely dominated by the Covid pandemic. The Nepalese were hit by several waves of infection, which cost some of our partners' lives. Several million vaccine doses came from sources such as the Covax initiative and donations, or were purchased from

India and China. A recent study by the Nepalese Ministry of Health shows a prevalence of corona antibodies in about 70 percent of the population. After the monsoon, tentative tourism has started again, bringing hope and much needed income to the people of Nepal. In Germany, the work of our board, the Nepal Day and several meetings on pandemic coordination of the German-Nepalese Society with Ambassadors Schäfer and Khadka took place virtually. Amppipal Hospital

The oxygen production plant was finally delivered and set up after two years of planning. The costs of approx. \$ 100,000 (USD) were jointly funded by six Rotary Clubs under the leadership of RC Warburg as well as Nepalmed and the America Nepal Medical Foundation. The second floor of the dormitory for student nurses was equipped with furniture. The Helmet Doctor Project Palungtar reached over 1,400 patients in remote parts of the district around Amppipal. Two paramedics and a doctor do home visits by motorbike to the elderly and those in need of care. The project was developed by the Nepal Development Society and funded by Nepalmed with € 26,000 for one year. We are continuing this project during the pandemic.

The hospital's drinking water pipeline was relaid from the spring on the northern slope of Ligligkot via the elevated tanks to the buildings. The construction was financed by the Rotary Club Vogtland Schloss Voigtsberg. *Ame Drews*

Dental department Amppipal

During the pandemic, at times only emergency treatments were carried out. Now the Dental Station at Amppipal is operational and running with 15-25 patients daily. Dental hygienist Mr. Prem treats a wide range of cases. Pain treatments combined with tooth extractions and fillings, but also dental cleanings, oral hygiene instruction and school check-ups are on his agenda.

Amppipal Sudarshan School

The school lunch – financed by Nepalmed – is important for the children, most of them from the poorest families in the region. However, due to low student numbers, the school is in danger of closing. KIRTIPUR HOSPITAL



Nepalmed funded the expansion of the trauma surgery ward with € 40,000. Flooring and electrics are laid, the bathrooms are installed. Another € 53.000 are available for equipment and furniture. We spend € 12.000 Euros annually for a manned ambulance of the Nepal Ambulance Service at the hospital. This has considerably improved the quality of care for acutely ill patients We provided € 20,000 in pandemic emergency aid for the equipment of

intensive care and general wards.

With the support from the Christmas Advent calendar 24 GUTE TATEN (24 GOOD DEEDS), a child screening programme at Kirtipur Hospital with additional outreach camps in schools in the area will start in 2022.
