An ultrasound machine for the Stupa Community Hospital in Boudha near Kathmandu was financed by the Saxon development aid.

The bodyplethysmograph, purchased for the lung clinic of the BPKIHS Dharan, was put into operation. The visitor toilets of the Wildlife Museum in Chitwan were inaugurated.

The Nepalese NGO Birat Nepal Medical Trust is launching a programme to find and treat latent (not yet infectious) cases of tuberculosis. The pilot phase will run in the districts of Pyuthan and Chitwan over a period of two years. Nepalmed will co-finance the project. The long-term goal is to use the acquired data to enable the government to implement the programme nationwide.

Management of the hospital was transferred from the municipality into the hands of Gandaki province. Thus, funding and staffing are secured. For the time being, there is no need for Nepalmed funds or skilled personnel

In Gorkha, Nepalmed is financing vending machines for the free distribution of menstrual pads and incinerators for ten schools.

The Gorkha Cultural Heritage Trail is managed by Asian Alpine Treks. A group from Nepalmed walked it in wonderful weather in February.

Kirtipur Hospital

In the hospital partnership programme of the German Society for International Cooperation to improve the diagnosis of chronic bronchitis, Halle University Hospital works with Nepalmed supporters in Kirtipur. Lung function training was organised for the staff of twelve hospitals as well as awareness camps for the population. We are purchasing a body plethysmograph now.

The search for funding a blood transfusion centre is currently underway together with the Warburg Rotary Club. Pushpa Joshi

HEALTH POSTS AND SCHOOLS



Nepalmed supports the operation of seven health posts in Solukhumbu. They serve thousands of households. The school in **Phera** received a new roof and will be extended with a kitchen and dining room in 2025. The school in **Chargare** received toilets and water pipes. In far west **Jajarkot**, a table for the operating room and a defibrillator were handed over.
